Academic Flexibility

- NEP welcomes the urgent need of reducing the dropout rates and adding flexibility in Higher Education learning with its Multiple Entry-Exit System (MEES).
- Undergraduate Certificate, who exit studies after the first year of graduation
- Undergraduate Diploma, who exit studies after two years of graduation
- Bachelor's Degree after three years
- Further there will be the flexibility of choices of subjects

A student is allowed to take three years to resume his studies at the Certificate level, Diploma level, or the Degree level, thereby the complete duration of the UG Program will be nine years.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

Major Subjects (18 credit points)

- Two Major Subjects from core faculty of 6 credit points each
- Third Major Subject of 6 credit points either from own faculty or the other faculty.

Minor Subjects (07 credit points)

- One Minor Elective of 4 credit points from other faculty; if third Major has opted from own faculty.
- One Vocational/skill Development Course of 3 credit points.
- One Co-Curricular Course of qualifying nature (40%)

Admission Ordinance & Guidelines:

- A student will have to select his Faculty (Arts, Science or Commerce) and He will opt for two Major Subjects; which He can continue till 6th Semester.
- Third Major Subject He can opt from his own faculty or other faculties.
- Major Subjects can be changed or arranged preferentially in the IInd/IIIrd year
- Minor elective Subject can be opted from own faculty or other faculty.
- Third Major Subject and Fourth Minor Subject will be selected in such a way that at least one subject must be from other faculty in order to ensure multidisciplinarity.
- Fourth minor elective cannot be opted from the minors of any of the three major Subjects already taken.
- Minor elective can be opted either in odd or even semester.
- The selection of minor elective will be from amongst the subjects taught in the Institution.
- In One Faculty Colleges, students can opt for minor elective from online platforms of the same credit points.

Skill Development & Co-curricular Courses

- A student will have to opt for one Vocational/Skill Development Course each semester for two years or four semesters; of 3 Credits each
- A student will have to opt for one co-curricular course in each of the six semesters; which will be qualifying in nature (40%).
- Furthermore, a student will have to undertake one Research Project each in the fifth and sixth semester; from one of the two major subjects in the third year in the form of an Industrial Training/Survey/Internship of qualifying nature. This Research Project can be inter-disciplinary also.

- A candidate has to opt for two major subjects from the group mentioned above by taking one subject from any group.
- A candidate has to choose the third subject (Major III) either from the groups mentioned below (own faculty) or from the *other faculty.

Group-A: Hindi, English, Sanskrit

Group-B: Drawing & Painting, Home Science, Education, Geography, Music, Sociology, Psychology, Physical Education

Group-C: Anthropology, Military Science, History, Political Science, Statistics.

- A Student can opt minimum of two and a maximum of three subjects from the Arts Faculty.
- No more than two Languages or litt. Subjects are allowed.
- Only two subjects from any of the above groups are allowed.

- A student cannot opt for more than two subjects from any group as Major I & II
- Third Major can be selected from Group-C (own faculty) or from other faculties.

Grey Areas & Suggestions:

- Minor Elective (4 credits): The affiliating Universities must provide Alternatives to minor elective papers in each subject:
 - So that multidisciplinary learning is ensured in the spirit of NEP-2020
 - Further this will de-escalate or split the choice of paper/subject selection
 - The course content should not be specialized instead should be of an introductory/general nature, otherwise, we will be creating Learning loads
 - The minor elective courses should be made learner-friendly and market-ready fields like Social work, Disaster Mngt, Income-Tax & GST filing, etc.
 - The options of minor elective papers in each subject should be immediately prepared and declared in order for the students to finalize their academic profile in advance with the appropriate choice of subjects.
 - So the concerned BOS should avoid using scissors and mend the syllabilearner-centric
 - The Computer-based Digital Courses should be so designed that they should be without any internal rider, as this is the demand of the day

Future Readiness:

- Employability profiling with respect to Certificate, Diploma, and Degree Level.
- In order to effectively execute the NEP-2020, level-playing fields, particularly with regard to structural facilities must be ensured as a prerequisite.
- Affiliating Universities should take the voices & concerns of Govt HEIs.
- Engaging & empowering learning through technology and teaching with technology. *Hybrid Learning has changed the art of possible*.
- Optimize human interaction: Flipped Classroom (Pre-recorded lectures are provided to self-prepare, the teacher interacts off-line/online for doubt clearance & problem solutions)

Future Readiness Contd.

- Creating a culture of Innovation
- Using assessment data to support learning (Competence-based assessment)
- Enabling access through better infrastructure like Campus Wi-Fi, well-equipped libraries, and laboratories
- Upskilling and Reskilling of the faculty members.
- Student Support through Counselling & Mentoring.
- Redesigning curricula as required by the Industry & Market
